


Sharing the GOOD NEWS February 2025

The first part of this rhyme reminds me of my initial visit to this area in early 2021. I was immediately attracted to the beautiful LCBTL building and of course to God's other magnificent creation of trees, water and weather. So, when I finally moved here, I ventured through those open church doors to see all the PEOPLE inside the building. I also saw those same PEOPLE & worshipped with them at the Lake services in God's natural temple. But it wasn't just the beauty of the church that kept me coming back in 2022. It was the PEOPLE inside who brought me to becoming a member in 2023.

Close the doors And hear them pray

I've already shared in my previous story just how important those prayers were for me during a very challenging year of personal loss so will not repeat here. Instead, I'd like to share what I've witnessed after being called to serve on the Call Committee and Congregational Council. If you are like me, you may be reluctant to get involved as a volunteer since from past experiences it seems too often a few people end up doing most of the work. You know:

Open the doors And they all walk away

Well after thought and prayer, I answered the calls putting all my trust in God's will and guidance. Feeling uncertain about my abilities to serve on a Committee charged with the work of calling a new pastor, with little to no personal history of LCBTL, and then being asked to serve as the Chair was overwhelming. However, God provided members that shared history, actively volunteered to share devotions, took notes and helped with

meeting logistics. God continued to provide so, so many PEOPLE doing His work including the Synod sending us qualified rostered ministers to consider. Pastor Greg accepted the call, and all the PEOPLE on the council, in the congregation, our community and his family all participated in God's call to LCBTL.

Currently serving as Council Vice President, I'm again faced with that overwhelming feeling of Chairing a Nominating Committee responsible for presenting candidates for future leadership roles. And with so many ministries and activities there are many PEOPLE doing God's work so when those church doors open, I know that they're not walking away but rather continuing this ongoing work. It is truly amazing to be part of this church community and trust me if you are called, you should know that you will not be alone. Rather you'll feel that you are part of all the PEOPLE, a healthy functioning body of fellow believers doing God's work. So when those doors open, please consider: Here am I, send me, send me!

President's Page-February Newsletter From the Desk of Sherri Kumle






